Ethical Dilemmas of Today's Humanitarian Aid Workers	Workshop McMaster's Friends of MSF (Doctors without Borders)	This workshop will address the humanitarian issues facing MSF workers throughout the world. Various case studies will be presented which focus on the ethics of humanitarian aid in conflict and disaster areas, with emphasis on implementing sustainable programs. The workshop aims to educate and generate discussion, which are among the first steps in prompting change.
Black is for Sunday	Documentary Screening by McMaster Chapter of Invisible Children: Navera Ammad	This session will present the Invisible Children Documentary, Black is for Sunday. Sunday has never known a day of peace and lives in a place that is not his home. He is displaced. Only 13 years old, there isn't a part of Sunday's life that hasn't been affected by the war. Orphaned at a young age, he lives in a displacement camp and struggles to survive amid the effects of poverty, disease, and malnutrition. With no one left to depend on, he must try and provide for himself. Okello Sunday's story will be shared through film, as he opens up about an experience that has formed his identity as a global citizen.
